## Disability

Gender

The school considers the needs of disabled people and makes reasonable adjustments where possible to meet the needs of disabled students according to the limitations of the premises. Our Social Programme takes the needs of disabled students into account with our Risk Assessments considering each activity and the suitability for physically impaired students i.e. wheelchair access.

## **Mental Health**

The school is aware that students may experience distress or mental illness during their stay. When this comes to our attention we do our best to support students and liaise with their family, agent or sponsor and our Employee Assistance Programme (EAP) provides support in their mother tongue.

## Homesickness

Our Safeguarding Team are trained to recognise and respond to the emotional well-being of our students. Our Designated Safeguarding Lead, Laura Chirio is also our trained Welfare Officer and holds pastoral care meetings every 4 weeks with long term students.

The school works to a high standard to ensure that the diverse needs of all students are recognised and met by taking account of legislative and regulatory requirements and by identifying key goals to be achieved.

No form of intimidation, bullying or harassment will be tolerated at the school. If a student believes they have been discriminated against in any way, they should inform the Director or The Designated Safeguarding Lead and the matter will be dealt with immediately.
